1	Chemistry Department	Department of Chemistry organized different programmes in the session such as swachchata pakhawara (1 <sup>st</sup> September to 15 September 2016), chemistry test (20 <sup>th</sup> oct. 2016), Student Seminar on world science day (13 <sup>th</sup> November 2016) a one day workshop on "Analysis of Food adulterants in milk" exhibition 17 <sup>th</sup> Feb. 2017, Chemistry Quiz (17 <sup>th</sup> Feb. 2017) debate on National Science day (28 <sup>th</sup> Feb 2017) Plantation programme (1 <sup>st</sup> march 2017).
2	Zoology Department	Department of Zoology observed Ozone Week from 16th September

		to 22 <sup>nd</sup> September 2016 like every year to create awareness among students and society to become environment friendly. Programmes like students rally, slogan writing, essay, quiz, chart model competition, power point presentation etc. were organized by the department during this week. The department also organized interdisciplinary lectures on various topic related to environment, international politics, bio-diversity etc.
3	Botany Department	The Botany Department organized World Ozone Week from 16-22 sept. 2016 with activities like rally for environmental awareness, ICT Presentation, lectures on various aspects of environment, essay writing etc. Besides, a programme on adulteration of food- a deep rooted social was organized to aware the society for adulteration in food items. Various interdisciplinary extension lectures were also organized.
4	Hindi Department	Hindi department started its association programmes with the celebration of Hindi Diwas on 14 <sup>th</sup> Sep. 2016. Later, the department conducted a debate competition followed by a group discussion on 'Folk Literature.' ICT too remained a priority for the department throughout the session. Students were encouraged to make and present Power Point Presentations that were highly praised by the experts. Besides, an essay competition was also organized to enable students to refine their expression through writing.
5	English Department/Urdu Department	English department encourages English students to learn English through ICT and innovative methodologies. Keeping in view this objective the department encouraged students to make power point presentations on the topics related to their Syllabus. Almost 300 students presented PPT and displayed their enormous potential. Besides, the English association organized various speech, debate, and English conversation competitions and programmes during its daily tutorial classes. In the annual function of English association a speech competition on the topic 'Importance of English Language in Present India' was organized. On the same day English association also organized an Urdu Taqreer competition on behalf of Urdu association.
6	Sanskrit Department	To develop leadership quality, participation skill, collective accountability and culture inclination Sanskrit department constituted its Association. Keeping in view its aims and objectives the association organized a Shlok recitation on Vivekanand Jayanti. Similarly, to develop writing skills of the students the association organized an essay competition on 18 <sup>th</sup> October 2016. Some of those essays were selected to get published in the college magazine 'Prashasti'. Besides, the department organized a Sanskrit General Knowledge Competition on 15 <sup>th</sup> January 2017, keeping in view different aspects of competitive examinations on 15 <sup>th</sup> January 2017.

		Sanskrit department also emphasized innovative methods and techniques for teaching and learning of the language. Therefore, several students presented power point presentations and the department organized a competition as well on 6 <sup>th</sup> Feb. 2017. The topic of the power point presentation was not specifically prescribed, rather selected by students themselves from broad Sanskrit Literature.
7	Music (Sitar) Department	The department organized a two day workshop on 'The framing of Sitar and its different part' (28 <sup>th</sup> September to 29 September 2016). On the second day of the workshop the resource person Shri Hasmat Ali gave a demonstrative lecture about Rag presentation and Riyaz. Moreover, students of Sitar Association initiated a campaign to get girls aware of sitar education and the instrument as well. Sitar Association also conducted model and slogan competition for students.
8	Music (Tabla) Department	Music Tabla department in collaboration with music (sitar) department organized a demonstrative lecture on 28 <sup>th</sup> sept 2016. Famous local artist of Tabla Mr. Rajendra Shrivatava told students about the structure and 'Sangat' Technique of the instrument Tabla. Tabla department conducted a broad campaign to aware common people about classical music in general and Tabla as a subject in particular. Besides, the department also organized various competitions such as model, slogan competition etc. The department also organized a one day musical camp at Bahigapur Village. Students presented solo and collab performances in the camp and a number of extension activities were also conducted to create awareness among villagers. On Yoga day (21 <sup>st</sup> June 2017) students and head of the department participated in a study tour to Om Ghat Bhitaura.
9	Music (Vocal) Department	Music Vocal Association organized a departmental lecture on famous scholar of music Pandit Vishnu Narayan Bhatkhande's birth anniversary. On 22 <sup>nd</sup> November 2016 the association organized a music Quiz competition and an essay competition on the topic "Contribution of Various Indian Music Artists". On 3 <sup>rd</sup> Jan. 2017 head of the department presented a power point lecture on 'Different aspects of Music Vocal.' Similarly, students of the department participated in Power Point Presentation on the topic 'Folk songs and their types in various dialects of Hindi Language'.
10	History Department	History department organized a speech competition to enable students to present themselves in a proper manner. Besides, the department organized a General Knowledge competition keeping in view NET, SLET and civil services preparation. An essay competition was also organized on "the impact of Mahatma Gandhi on Modern Life" (6 <sup>th</sup> Dec. 2016)

A Health Camp with the collaboration of district hospital and Fatehpur administration was organized by the department. Almost 1000 students benefitted by the camp. Besides, skill development programmes like baking, cooking, sewing etc. were also conducted by the department with IQAC.
12	Political Science Department	The department started its departmental activities with a workshop on skill development on 8 <sup>th</sup> August 2016. It was explained in the workshop that all skill development institutions will be linked with National Skill Development Mission with the mission to develop skills at the international level. The Political Science Association conducted a poster and speech competition on the topic 'Black Money- Problem and Solution' on 30 <sup>th</sup> Nov. 2016. The department organized a student seminar on the topic 'Relevance of Pandit Nehru's Vision of Modern India' on 1 <sup>st</sup> December 2016. Apart from above mentioned programmes, the department organized a two day national seminar on the topic 'Environment and Relevance of Gandhian Values' sponsored by Higher Education Department Uttar Pradesh.
13	Sociology Department-	Sociology department organized a debate competition on the theme 'The Effect of Western Values on Indian Culture'. Students also presented their power point lectures on the topic, 'The double role of working women'.
14	Physical Education Department	Physical Education department has been actively involved in development all round personality of students. The association organized a quiz competition on 18 <sup>th</sup> Jan. 2017 and an essay competition on 21 <sup>st</sup> Jan 2017. In sports and games related activities the department organized a number of indoor and outdoor games including Cricket, Football, Volleyball, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Badminton, Table Tennis, Chess, Carom etc. between 21 <sup>st</sup> October 2016 to 27 <sup>th</sup> Jan 2017. Annual Sports meet was organized on 13 <sup>th</sup> & 14 <sup>th</sup> Feb 2017. In this meet various events of athletics such as races, jumps, throws, etc. were conducted.
15	NCC DR BRA G	Session 2016-17 was remarkable for the institution because NCC unit started in the college. In this unit three year training would be provided to the cadets. 155 students will be taking this training. In the beginning of the session 50 cadets were selected through mental and physical test. NCC cadets got involved in traffic control, voters awareness and other social works.
16	Rangers	Rangers students contributed in cleaning the banks of the College. A three day camp was also organized from 16-12-2016 to 18-12- 2016 under supervision of trained experts where students were trained in disaster management, to make tent and bridge, cook food without utensils and many more.





**Goal-** N.C.C. aims to enable the efficient achievements of a nationally consistent and minimum necessary building design. It aims at developing character, comradeship, discipline, a secular outlook and selfless service amongst young students.

**The Context-** Keeping N.C.C.'s goals in view the institute started N.C.C. unit from the session 2016-17.

**The Practice-** N.C.C. unit of the college provides three years of rigorous training. Fifty seats have been allotted for every year. It means 150 students are trained simultaneously. Besides, a number of other achievements were credited to the unit.



#### **Title- Suggestion and Complaint Box**

#### Goal-

#### The Context-

Like the last session this practice continued in the present session too. It was realised by the IQAC that the practice of suggestion and complaint box proved to be very useful, as it was a lot easier for students to present their problems and suggestions without hesitation.

**The practice:-** The complaint/suggestion box has been placed at a point that is easily reachable to students. It has been ensured that students feel comfortable in putting their problems & suggestions without any fear & hesitation. The box is opened time to time in the strict vigil of the principal and a committee specially formed for dealing with the matters of complaint/suggestion box. All the complaints are looked into by the administration & tried to be sorted out. After sorting out the problems the administration informs all the students about the proceedings through notices & announcement. All the faculty members & non teaching staff are informed about complaints/suggestions of students and instructed to cooperate in solving students' problems.

**Evidence of success-** The practice succeeded tremendously as more than seventy complaints/suggestions were received from the students. IQAC along with other cells and college administration ensured proper addressing of students' problems. Even students' feedback about the practice was very encouraging. Thus, the practice is as successful as it can be.

**Problems encountered and resources required-** Sometimes, the college administration remained extremely busy in examinations and other administrative responsibilities. Therefore, it was difficult to manage regular attention to suggestion and complaint box. Besides, sometimes students put in some irrelevant complaints and suggestions that were practically impossible to get addressed.


