#### 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Govt. Girls' P. G. college, Fatehpur provides a holistic multidisciplinary educational environment. The institution aims to attain the global standards in providing quality education. The following opportunities have already been in place for the last few years: Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Govt. Girls' P. G. college, Fatehpur has signed MoU with District Fisheries Department of Fatehpur, Govt. ITI Fatehpur and ACEM Khaga, Fatehpur for study of various vocational courses like fisheries, computer application and beautician. The college has an active Research and Innovation Cell (RIC) to nurture research culture among the faculty members and students. On regular basis RIC organises seminars, workshops and training sessions on academic writing, impact centric research and funding opportunities. The E-Learning Cell of this College has initiated a step towards the knowledge building process using online platform. Webinars, seminars and workshops are conducted by different departments and committees time to time which are of multidisciplinary nature. This College has an enriching ecosystem that supports creativity and innovation skill of students, which integrates humanities and science with STEM. Some of the good practices implemented by the College to promote multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary approach in view of NEP 2020 are promotion of sustainable environment, social commitment and community outreach. Students are encouraged to participate in various activities like paper recycling, rainwater harvesting, environment conservation and educating the underprivileged. There is complete implementation of NEP 2020 from the session 2021-22 as per NEP 2020 guidelines and regulations of Govt. of U. P. in order to develop a holostic multidiscplinary education system in the Institute/College. In this regard Institute has given choice to the students of any faculty (Science and Arts) can choose two major subjects of her own faculty and remaining one major subject can choose either from own faculty or from another faculty. Selection of minor subject can be choosen from any faculty as per its own choice. Vocational courses can be selected from the given list of affiliated University by the Institute/College. The Institute has offer flexible and innovative curricula that includes creditbased courses and projects in the areas of community engagement and service, environmental education and value-based towards the attainment of a holistic and multidisciplinary education.

#### 16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The ABC regulations intend to give impetus to blended learning mode, allowing students to earn credits from various HEIs registered under this scheme and through SWAYAM, an online repository of courses. The student can earn up to 50 % credits from outside the college/university where she/he is enrolled for the degree/diploma program. Academic Bank of Credits facilitates deposition of credits awarded by Registered Higher Education Institutions, for courses pursued therein, in the Academic Bank Account of the student and the validity of such credits shall be as per norms and guidelines issued by the University/UGC. Online registration of the students has been started in Digilocker and Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) since 2022-23 session at the time of Admission in the Institute. Since then students get enrolled under CBCS. As per the new National Education Policy 2020, our college will take necessary initiatives under ABC guidelines of NEP as per norms and guidelines issued by the University/UGC. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Govt. Girls' P. G. college, Fatehpur is a constituent college abides by the University rules/norms. Some of the initiatives taken the college in this direction are given below: The academic curriculum is designed by the respective departments of different courses offered by the colleges of Prof. Rajendra Singh (Rajju Bhaiya) University, Prayagraj and faculty members have been involved in the preparation of course content as a subject expert in the committee of courses constituted by the respective departments. Within the approved curricular framework of the Prof. Rajendra Singh (Rajju Bhaiya) University, Prayagraj, faculty members use different curricular and pedagogical tools and approaches for teaching-learning activities. During Covid-19 pandemic as per Govt. order all faculty members as well as students started online classes continously in order to continue student's education through various online platforms like Zoom, Google meet, Whatsapp Group, Microsoft Teams etc. Several training sessions to use online platform in an effective matter for teaching-learning and other co-curricular activities were conducted. Reading materials, assignments, question papers and other relevant study materials are also regularly uploaded on portal developed by the Prof. Rajendra Singh (Rajju Bhaiya) University, Prayagraj. Students are encouraged to search and read recent research published articles to prepare assignments. Students are motivated to study eBooks which are available on website of Prof. Rajendra Singh (Rajju Bhaiya) University, Prayagraj Library and IIT Kharagpur digital library.

#### 17.Skill development:

Skill development helps to build up strong foundation for learners. So in order to importance of skills in life, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Govt. Girls' P. G. college, Fatehpur has also taken many steps to help students in becoming more skilled and job oriented as mentioned below: The college has E-learning Cell to equip students with the necessary IT skills. To complement the discipline-specific university curriculum, the college organizes extra-curricular activities to impart holistic and value-based education. The NSS Unit regularly organizes activities to promote community responsibility: cleanliness campaigns, health screenings, blood donation camps, skill-building seminars, literacy campaigns and social awareness programs, etc. The Women's Development Cell has made consistent efforts in creating awareness about gender issues. To inculcate citizenship values, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Govt. Girls' P. G. college, Fatehpur organized various field trips of Historical, Cultural and Scientific institutes like Bawni Imli, Govt. Medical College Fatehpur and Visit of Spritual place Om Ghat at the bank of Holy river the Ganga.

### 18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Govt. Girls' P. G. college, Fatehpur offers the undergraduate courses in B. A. (Hindi, English, Sanskrit, Urdu, Political Science, History, Home Science, Sociology, Music Sitar, Tabla & Vocal, Physical Education) and B. Sc. (Bio) as well as P. G. in Zoology, Hindi Literature, Political Science and History. The curriculum of these four programmes comprises courses that impart the historical, cultural and scientific knowledge traditions of India. In addition to the curricular prospects, these departments conduct several co-curricular programmes that foster the dissemination of Indian history, culture, and scientific knowledge traditions among the young students at the college including handicraft exhibition of student's made Items, poster competition on voter awareness among young voters, poster and model exhibition competition on National Science day, poster and essay writing competition on World Ozone day and distribution of Tiranga as per "Azadi ka Amrit Mahotasava" etc. in 2022-23. In the year 2022-23, the college hosted a Inter collegiate cricket championship of affiliating University in which our college team won the trophy in women category. College has also organized a 10 days workshop on "Awadhi Lokgeet va Loknritya" in collaboration with Chetriya Sanskritik Kendra Prayagraj (Sanskriti Vibhag Uttar Pradesh)

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since 8th Dec. -17th Dec. 2022 in which students benefitted with various vidhas of Awadhi Lokgeet and Loknritya under "Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat" scheme of central Govt, College organized various programmes in this session like a ralley organized on Shahido ki Smriti Diwas to commemorate the role of martyer's of the country and an essay competition under "Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsava" on completition of Independence of 75 years. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Govt. Girls' P. G. college, Fatehpur caters to students from diverse linguistic and economic background. To fulfill the learning needs and levels of these students, faculty members of the college engage in a bilingual mode of lecture delivery. In continuation to the efforts in this regard, the college has constituted Indian language and cultural cell to promote the use and application of various Indian mother tounge languages. Official communications, minutes of meeting, and important college publications are brought out in bilingual mode. The college website is also hosted in a bilingual mode. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Govt. Girls' P. G. college, Fatehpur offers degree course in Hindi, Sanskrit, Urdu and English language. College also offers various compulsory co-curricular subjects in different semesters as per NEP 2020 like Food Nutrition and Hygine, Human Values and Environment etc. Basic Principles of Indian Medicine System Ayurveda, Yoga, Unani, Siddha and Homeopathy (AYUSH) are taught to the UG students as a paper entitled "Ethno botany and Phyto chemistry" under the subject Botany and Physical Education to the students of other department to familiarize them with the vast heritage of Indian AYUSH system, popular in local inhabitants. Every year various events and competitions are organized by the departments where students are encouraged to participate so that they learn more about the Indian languages, History, Indian culture and their importance in Indian Education System. Every year college also celebrates Hindi Diwas, Urdu Diwas, National Education Day etc. In addition to these efforts all faculty member of college deliver his/her lecture in bilingual mode to clear the subject's concept of Students.

#### 19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The courses offered by Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Govt. Girls' P. G. college, Fatehpur are based on the curriculum designed by Prof. Rajendra Singh (Rajju Bhaiya) University, Prayagraj. Many faculty members of the college are also involved in designing this curriculum. In addition, the college has created an ecosystem for transformation of curriculum towards outcome based education. We empower students to become a good citizen, teachers,

entrepreneurs, scientists, soldiers, and administrator with motivation. Some of the common outcomes outlined for the programs of study offered at this College are knowledge acquisition, analytical skills, application of knowledge and problem solving, etc. Our college organizes several academic events such as webinars/seminars/panel discussions and workshops to provide interactive platform for knowledge acquisition among students. We impart the attitude to keep learning, remain updated and readily adopt new developments in various technologies regarding their subject matter as well as their holistic personality development. For example: Faculty of Science provides opportunities to the students to make and display their models and cartoons regarding various scientific theories/phenomenon by which they can learn practically the subject. In this regard other faculty students are also benefitted. Various faculty members allotted projects to college students for encouraging to participate in several minor projects under the NEP 2020. For example, during the year 2022-23, department of Botany gives a project on "Collection, Identification and preparation of Harbarium of local flora". As well as department of Zoology gives a project on "the study of flora and fauna of pond ecosystem" of College campus pond. Discussions held during regular classes about the text and references to handle real-time problems and challenges assist students in identifying more problem areas and also helps in analyzing and developing solutions using basic principles of their subjects. For example, discussion on several infectious disease to tackle real life disease problems conducted by Department of Zoology, Botany, Physical Education and Home Science. In addition, fostering team spirit and leadership among students through group activities in the class and in cocurricular activities are also carried out. One of the objectives of NEP 2020 is the transformation of concepts into practice. Several new initiatives have been taken by the college in this direction: Creating a learner centric environment; focus on students' understanding of the outcomes of the course; facilitating academic and research as well as problem solving skills-based discussions conducted in the class. Mentoring and continuous assessment of learners: Mentor-mentee meeting conducted on regular basis to address several problems of students. Encouraging application of knowledge for solutions: Students were sensitize towards the sustainable environmental goals through the classes taken as a part of their curriculum under co-curricular subject Human Values and Environment.

#### **20.Distance education/online education:**

ODL (Open and Distance Learning ) is a system of education wherein teachers and learners need not to be present either at same place. After pandemic Covid-19, dramatic changes occurred in various field of human life by which our education system have also highly affected by this pandemic resulting in the development of online education in India. In this college, teachers also started to teach their students by using various online platforms like Google meet, microsoft teams, Zoom App to interact, study, communicate and provide them online resources (Google form, e-content, PDFs, subject related videos) and uploaded them on the open e-learning source i.e. at YouTube channel and on affiliating University website etc.. So that they can be accessed by the student at any time point of the day continuously. This gave great confidence to both faculty members as well as the students to remain connected to each other. As, NEP 2020 focuses on the blended learning i.e. both offline and online teaching and learning for better output, not only students but faculty members also made an effort to improve their online teaching capabilities by participating different faculty development programs (FDPs) and workshops to upgrade themselves in this digital era and equipped themselves to meet the need of their students. In this college, digital library is also present by which students are benefitted.

Office automation packages like MS Office and Antivirus are purchased by the college and updated periodically.
